Zukunftskolleg Lecture with Ulrich Raulff: "Wie schreibt man

die Geschichte von Mensch und Pferd?"

We are very happy to welcome Prof. Dr. Dr. h.c. Ulrich Raulff as the 10th speaker in the Zukunftskolleg Lecture series. Ulrich Raulff is the director of the Deutsches-Literaturarchiv Marbach (German Literature Archive). In his presentation, he reflects on the findings in his latest publication "Das letzte Jahrhundert der Pferde. Eine Trennung" (The last century of horses. A separation, 2015), in which he gives a historical overview on the development of the relationship between man and horse. The Lecture is subtitled "Blinde Flecken, versunkene Bibliotheken und die Dialektik von Zahn und Zeit" (Blind spots, lost libraries and the dialectic of tooth and time) and will be held in German.

The Lecture will be followed by an opportunity for personal discussion with the speaker and the audience. Finger food and beverages will be provided.

Joint Symposium with the Martin Buber Society:

"Mobility. A Concept and a Way of Life"

On June 27-28, 2016, representatives of both the Buber Society of Fellows and the Zukunftskolleg met to discuss "Mobility: A Concept and a Way of Life," held in the Museum of Art and Cars in the town of Singen.

The workshop opened with Ruth HaCohen's general typology of mobility as a concept, which was followed by two intensive days of talks and discussions about mobility in diverse domains, from religion to chemistry, from sociology to biology, from language to photography, and more. It was a truly interdisciplinary meeting, with real synergy and a sense of getting closer to insights into the nature of mobility. Not wanting to let these insights slip away, we will be holding a second joint



meeting in Jerusalem in December 2016.

The Martin Buber Society of Fellows in the Humanities in Jerusalem aims to offer young and outstanding scientists of the Humanities and Social Sciences a creative and vivid research landscape. Like the Zukunftskolleg, the Martin Buber Society is interdisciplinary and supports excellence in research. The collaboration and exchange between the two institutions therefore bears high potential and proved to be fruitful.
