At the beginning of 2013, around 40 musicians founded Wind Symphonica out of a personal need: the places for wind instrumentalists in the university orchestra were simply not enough to enable all interested people to make music. So, without further ado, they decided to found a new orchestra.

The right conductor was quickly found in Ralph Brodmann, who already had a lot of experience in conducting symphonic wind orchestras as the conductor of the Konstanz Youth Wind Orchestra (Jugendblasorchester Konstanz) for many years. Brodmann grew up in Constance and studied music in Winterthur, majoring in clarinet. He teaches the instruments clarinet and saxophone at the Constance Music School and the Kreuzlingen Cantonal School and participates in various chamber music and band formations, orchestras and musical productions.

Our repertoire ranges from contemporary symphonic wind music to arrangements of classical works for wind music, fast Latin American rhythms and impressive programme music to the most famous pieces from film, television and musicals.

Over the past ten years, we have been able to delight our audiences in numerous concerts – including double concerts with friendly ensembles, benefit and open-air concerts – and are now looking forward to our anniversary concert in the summer.

Weihan Zhao

Weihan Zhao (赵玮晗) has been a member of Wind Symphonica since 2022. He is from Beijing and learned to play the drums in primary and middle school from Zong-yue Wen. He gained orchestral experience in the Dunshan Symphonic Wind Orchestra, the Beijing Wind Orchestra and the Beijing Symphony Orchestra, among others. In 2022 he came to the University of Konstanz to do his doctorate in ecology. In addition to Wind Symphonica, he currently plays percussion at Musikverein Petershausen.

The Vibraphone

The vibraphone belongs to the percussion instruments. Similar to a glockenspiel, it has tuned metal bars that are arranged like a piano keyboard. The plates are beat with rather soft mallets, for example made of felt. Underneath the plates are resonance tubes that can be opened and closed in variable frequencies with the help of small motorised flaps. The instrument got its name from the resulting vibrato effect.
